RULES

The show is affiliated to Shetland Pony Stud-Book Society.

All registered Shetland ponies must not exceed 42" at maturity.

Three old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown.

All foals must be a minimum of 3 weeks old on the day of the show, and date of birth must be stated on entry form.

All entire males aged 2 years and over must display a stallion disc.

No cutting whips or canes exceeding 30".

Unregistered ponies of Shetland type under 42" can enter classes 20—24.

Young Handlers. In the interests of safety a hard hat must be worn by young handlers aged 14 years or under in In Hand section.

There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes.

Children under 14 years old must not show colts {excluding foals} or stallions in the In Hand classes.

All children's age as 1st January each year, and must be stated on the entry form.

Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring.

All ponies entered for the show ***must be named*** and be the ***bona fide property*** of the competitor.

Only rosettes will be awarded – there is no prize money.

The show committee and Caledonian Marts accepts no responsibility whatever for injury, loss or damage to any person, animal, or property on the day of the show.

Members are reminded that they should have their own public liability insurance.

The show committee reserve the right to split or amalgamate any class on the show depending on entries forward.

Classes will be judged in catalogued order and exhibitors are requested to have their animals forward in time.

The committee reserve the right to change the timetable if considered necessary.

The committee reserve the right for ponies to be measured.

The judges' decisions are final.

A judge may not place in a class a pony, which to his/her knowledge has been sold, bred, leased, or produced by the Judge or his/her immediate family or employer: nor may he/she place a pony in which he/she has a financial interest: nor may he/she place a stallion by whom he/she has had a mare stunted in that season. Should a situation arise when such a pony appears, a referee, preferably on the appropriate panel of judges, should be appointed by the show secretary to place the pony in question in its position in the class.

Objections or protests must be made in writing, giving full name and address, within 30 minutes of the conclusion of the class concerned and lodged with the Show Secretary with the sum of £20.00. This sum will be returned if the objection is sustained.

Junior Section

Ridden classes will follow NPS rules. Correctly secured current BE1384/PAS015 Skull/Riding hats must be worn at all times when mounted. A fall from a pony or rider dismounting in any class will result in disqualification and must not remount in the ring. Ponies in the lead rein class must be shown in a snaffle with the lead rein attached to the noseband only. Riders must be 3 years and over on the show day.

Judge: Mr S Rendall (Hollydell)

Class 24 Lead Rein - Rider to have attained their 3rd birthday but not their 9th birthday before the 1st January 2020.

Class 25 First Ridden - Riders to have attained their 3rd birthday but not reached their 12th birthday before the 1st January 2020. Walk and trot on go round but can canter in individual show.

Class 26 Open Ridden – open to mares, geldings and stallions 4 years and over to be ridden by rider of appropriate age, weight and height. Riders of stallions must have reached their 12th birthday before 1st January 2020.

Ridden Championship

1st & 2nd place prize winners are eligible.
